



### Biden and Harris take the White House

### A historic election for the US.

- After days of uncertainty, the Democratic party <u>can</u>didate, Joe Biden, has been declared the winner of the US presidential election, which was held on the 3rd of November. The results of the election were finally announced on Saturday, the 7th of November.
- The race was very close, and Biden's <u>victory</u> was not as big as experts had predicted; he has just over 50% of the <u>popular vote</u>. However, he has secured the necessary number of votes from <u>key</u> states like Pennsylvania, Arizona, and Michigan.
- 3. <u>Voter turnout</u> was high, with many Americans voting by mail because of the coronavirus pandemic. Biden's main support came from women, African Americans, white voters with college degrees, and the populations of large cities. He received more individual votes than any other presidential candidate in the country's history.
- Biden has 47 years of experience in politics, including 30 years as a senator and, more significantly, serving as vice-president under Barack Obama from 2009-

- 2017. He has been aiming for the White House since 1987. His running mate, vice-president-elect Kamala Harris is not only the first woman to achieve this position, but she is also the first African American and the first Asian American to do so. Harris was elected Senator for the state of California in 2017 and has experience in state government as district attorney.
- 5. Biden's campaign promised a change of direction for the country. He plans to continue fighting the coronavirus pandemic, fix the country's economy, and reduce the political divide in the US. The country has seen more than 230,000 deaths from Covid-19, while millions of Americans have lost their jobs as a result of the pandemic. Biden will improve testing for the virus and listen carefully to what scientific experts advise.
- 6. Meanwhile, Donald Trump disputes the results of the election and is planning legal action. He has not produced any evidence of voter fraud so far. Biden and Harris take office on January 20, 2021.
